## Treasurer's Report

1. No updates on membership and hassle free campaign
2. Next up for filing deadlines is Annual Personal Property Tax by April 2017
3. Winter Dance wrap-up: did well, $\$ 423.50$ in food sales and expenses came in within reason. Overall family enrichment has spent about half their budget and exceeded their income per budget
4. Spirit Wear- Told by Megan that she has checks to deposit, but still waiting for them
5. Book Fair- income was below budget by about $\$ 500$, but expenses came in way under budget (\$997). They did a fabulous job of collecting and organizing deposit and cash - Kudos to Cris B!
6. Community Partners- Amazon Smile came in this month (every quarter EFT), Hershey park and Orioles will help us reach budget (\$70/quarter)
7. Restaurant Night- need volunteer to set up something before spring break...How's Glory days going? Kelly will call Chipotle
8. Cultural Arts- doing well and staying within budget...checks went out for Ken Scott, Mr. Bond Science Guy and Club Scientific
9. Related Arts budget- PE used $\$ 1998$ out of 2000 for heart rate monitors and equipment..fantastic. Spent $\$ 300$ out of $\$ 1200$ concert budget ( $\$ 900$ for spring concerts)
10. Special Days- Used $\$ 350$ for International night our of Misc budget. Ms. Jacobs and Cyndy notifies of $\$ 50$ for Science Fair/STEM Night
11. Teacher IA- rolling in. Final hard deadline is $3 / 21$ for team leaders to turn in receipts
12. Team Picnics- Valentines budget was $\$ 850$, went over (spent $\$ 1448.58$ ), I will let Kelly and Kelly discuss and field any questions. - At previous meeting, PTAs were asked to consider increasing dues to $\$ 200$, with the $\$ 30$ increase going to fund the special schools

Superintendent's Report

- BOE FY 2018 Budget Request - BOE has approved its Operating Budget Request for the 2017-2018 school year totaling 872.4 million. This amount represents a net increase of 3.5 million over the Superintendent's budget request and 64 million over the amount funded for the FY 2017 school year
- Budget additions include
- 93.5 new positions
- Increases in funding for summer school, intramural programs
- Budget cuts:
- all school websites
- live video streaming of commencement ceremonies and other events
- staff retirement celebrations
- staff service milestone recognitions
- Gallup student strength and staff engagement initiatives
- Reduction in school system legal fees
- Reduction in contracted services and supplies for communications and human resources

Many thanks to the devoted Book Fair Committee: Amber Sites, Bernadine Zissu, Erin McGinnis, and Scarlet Goon. Thank you to the Media Staff: Mrs. Joshephson, Ms. Haavik, and Mrs. McQuarry. Thanks to the many volunteers( new and veteran) who helped work the book fair to get such wonderful books in the hands of our students at Waverly.

Saral has the final number in cash that the PTA received from the Book Fair sales after the deposit.

We did just over \$17,000 in sales (includes the online orders).
Collected $\$ 167$ for All for Books! Waverly families are so so generous!
Bought the Media Center and Ms. Frederick for her reading program: \$929.57 in new books!
Each teacher received a book from their wish list from the PTA: \$240.66
We had 15 students who won in the Marshmallow guessing game and bought \$121.85 in books for them.
Gave out $\$ 70$ in gift certificates to custodians and guest teacher readers.
Very Successful! Waverly still has $\$ 600$ in Scholastic Dollars in our account on reserve for the following year or if something comes up and the PTA would like to buy something additional from the Scholastic Catalog. (better to keep on reserve in Scholastic dollars vs. cashing out).

The 3 extended days on the fair went well. We had positive feedback from the teachers and media specialists. Evening hours were hopping! Ice Cream Social and Teacher Guest Readers were very successful! Thank you to Erin McGinnis who organized it. She was able to get $100 \%$ of the Ice Cream donated from Harris Teeter and we received a $\$ 25$ gift card from Weis! Thank you to our community grocery stores!

Backorders and Online orders were filled today except for 1 student who we made a special call into Scholastic and she should get her book soon!

A suggestion was made that we might do the Book Fair the same week as teacher conferences next year?
Pro:
Increased traffic at school!
Con:
We usually run the book fair during a 5 full day week vs. 3 full days and 2 half days. Jump Rope for Heart is usually going on at the same time.
Friday is a half day and we that is the night we do the ice cream social, might impact sales?

Kelly, let me know your thoughts so I can reserve our fair for next year.

Year-end picnic - we're exploring different options. We're looking to hold it at Waverly (instead of off campus), but looking to have some activities that go along with the picnic (to keep the children occupied, since they won't have access to the fields/playground). I'll have a better idea of a date now that this storm is over and we know (more or less) when the last day of school will be.
